

Doubt & Uncertainty: Part of unbelief or part of faith?



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# 1. Recognizing the Commonness of Doubt:

▶ Doubt and questions are often part of the path <u>to</u> faith and the life <u>of</u> faith.

► If you trust *him <u>through</u> your* doubt, he will surely bring you out.

2 Timothy 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course (the race), I have kept the faith:

#### 1. Recognizing the Commonness of Doubt

- ► Teaching a healthy mindset around doubt
- ► Understanding types and seasons of doubt and the corresponding hard questions
- ► Bringing to light examples of healthy journeys through doubt
- ► Modeling healthy vulnerability

# 2. Welcoming the Necessary Questions

► Readiness: Preparing heart and mind

► Invitation: Making space for questions

► Response: "I'm glad you asked..."

#### 2. Welcoming the Necessary Questions:

► Readiness: Preparing heart and mind

1 Peter 3:15

But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts:

and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you

with meekness (gentleness) and fear (respect):

► Right heart, life, and focus on the Lord

Sufficiently Equipped

► Anchored in Hope

► Gentle & Respectful

#### 2. Welcoming the Necessary Questions:

► Invitation: safe space for questions to surface

John 16:19: Now Jesus knew that they were desirous to ask him, and said unto them, Do ye inquire among yourselves of that I said...

Acts 20:20 And how I kept back nothing that was profitable unto you, but have shewed you, and have taught you publicly, and from house to house,

#### 2. Welcoming the Necessary Questions:

▶ Is our initial response: "I'm Glad you Asked"?

Colossians 4:6 Let your speech be always with grace, seasoned with salt, that ye may know how ye ought to answer every man.

▶ What do you want them to feel?

▶ What do you want them to do?

► How do you get there?

#### Learning from Paul:

- 1 Corinthians 9:20-23
- ▶ And unto the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might gain the Jews; ... To them that are without law, as without law,... that I might gain them that are without law. To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak:
- ▶ I am made all things to all men, that I might by all means save some.

- ► Meet them where they are, find out where they've been
  - ► Surface vs. Layers; Emotions/Relationships vs. Intellect

- ► Dialogue and relationship, not just answers
  - ► Answer questions with questions
  - ► Caution: Direct declarative answers can shut down dialogue and relationship.
  - ► Instead: explore perspectives, provide frameworks
  - ▶ Be careful over-simplifying. Be careful over-complicating

- ► Love -- what matters most the more excellent way
  - ▶ I can have all the answers and all the faith in the world, but if I don't have love -- it all avails to nothing. (1 Corin 13)

- ► Hope: Gentle confidence in God to provide answers
  - ► When I don't feel equipped, tap into the gifts of the Body of Christ (1 Corin 12:8-9)

- ▶ Prayer, Compassion, Encouragement (2 Timothy 1:3-5)
  - ▶ ...without ceasing I have remembrance of thee in my prayers night and day... being mindful of thy tears...
  - ▶ When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee...

- ► Time, Experience, and the Holy Spirit (John 16:12-13)
  - ▶ I have yet many things to say unto you, but ye cannot bear them now.
  - ► Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth

#### Sunday School & Youth

- Proactive teaching
  - ► Starts early -- Age Appropriate New Curriculum
  - ► Stories / examples / making space for hard questions
- ► When questions come...
  - ► Opportunity or Distraction?
  - ► Answer vs. Relationship

- ► Teacher awareness, gifting, training, resources
- ► Support for Parents

#### Keeping it all in perspective

Jesus was a safe person to ask questions, and yet...

- ► Mark 9:32 But they understood not that saying, and were afraid to ask him.
- ▶ John 6:66 From that *time* many of his disciples went back, and walked no more with him.

#### Thankfully,

- ► God is "longsuffering to us-ward, not willing that any should perish..." (2 Peter 3:9)
- ► God has not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind. (2 Timothy 1:7)
